Australian Curriculum	
English	Maths
Unit 4  . Through a novel study, students explore themes of interpersonal relationships and ethical dilemmas in real-world or imagined settings. They will identify narrative text structures and language features, recognising how authors often adapt these. Students will identify and explain author style and analyse how language features work together to meet the purpose of the narrative. Students will plan, create, edit and publish a written imaginative text, organised into characteristic stages and phases of a narrative. Ideas are developed and expressed in varied and cohesive paragraphs, using a variety of complex sentences, expanded and sharpened through careful choice of vocabulary.	Unit 4  Students will solve problems involving finding a fraction, decimal or percentage of a quantity and use estimation to find approximate solutions to problems involving rational numbers and percentages. They will identify and explain rules used to create growing patterns and create and use algorithms to generate sets of numbers, using a rule. Students will assign probabilities using common fractions, decimal and percentages. Students conduct simulations using digital tools, to generate and record the outcomes from many trials of a chance experiment. They compare observed frequencies to the expected frequencies of the outcomes of chance experiments.
Science	HASS (Humanities and Social Sciences) Term 3&4
Unit 4 In this unit students will explore the environmental conditions that affect the growth and survival of living things. They will use simulations to plan and conduct fair tests and analyse the results of these tests.	Australia's global connections  Students conduct an inquiry to answer the question: 'How does tourism at the Great Barrier Reef affect people and places?'  Australia in a Diverse World  Students demonstrate an understanding of the diversity of places by representing, interpreting and describing data and information about the characteristics of places.  Making decisions to benefit the community  Students explain ways that resources can be used to benefit individuals, the community and the environment.

Unit 1 Symmetry and Dance Students respond to, choreograph and perform dance that uses symmetry as a stimulus to communicate a theme.	Unit 2  In this unit, students will explore the health-related fitness components of a range of physical activities and the importance of physical activity participation to health and wellbeing. They will apply the elements of movement to compose and perform a fitness activity station that develops a health-related fitness component.
